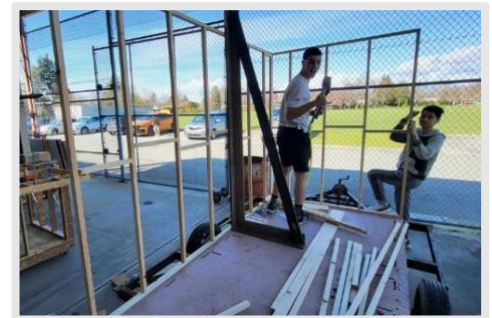
Currently, the team is engaged in spring cleaning in the robotics room, organizing shelves to make materials more accessible for the coming years. With the future of the club, school, and workforce in mind, team leaders have been training junior members in engineering and business. In the engineering fields, members have learned shop safety, metalworking skills, and design, and are currently constructing a new competition robot from scratch using online resources such as EveryBot. In the business fields, members have developed photo-media and communication skills, including managing the team's Instagram account @breakerrobotics, website at <https://breaker-robotics.weebly.com/>, and more.



Moving forward, the team continues to prioritize collaboration, hosting meetings, building sessions, and workshops. A strong team community forms the basis for inspiration and growth, and sponsors play a key role in supporting our team.  Other tools you will learn include grounding, visualizations, emotion regulation and self-care.

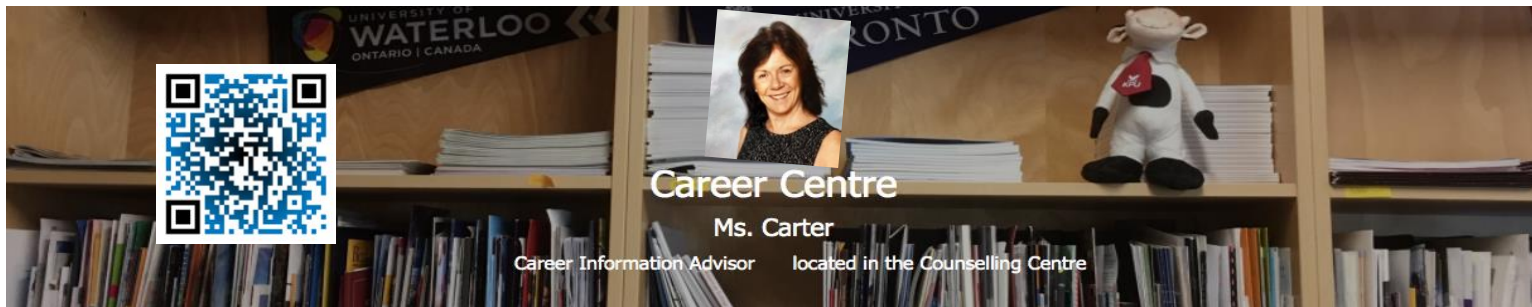
