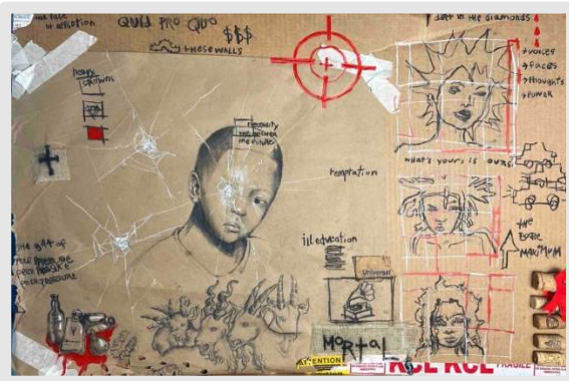
JNB New Year Arts Festival!

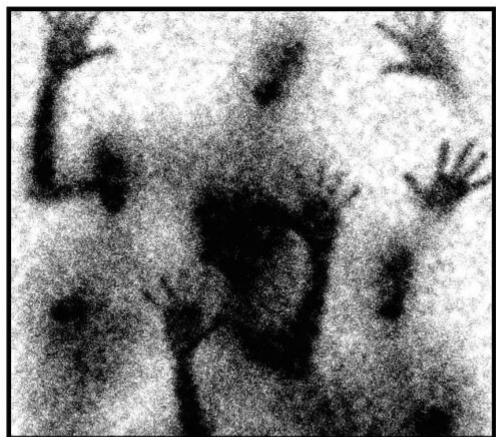


New Course: Asian Studies 12

As of next year, students at Burnett will have the option of taking **Asian Studies 12** as their senior social studies credits! Asian Studies 12 is a course that offers students the opportunity to understand and analyze some of the complex issues facing today's Asia (from Taiwan to Turkey). This is a region which has 60% of the world's population and three (China, India and Japan) of the largest four economies in the world.

In Asian Studies 12, students will examine the links between Asia's recent history and culture with some of the present day political, economic, social/cultural and environmental issues. Students will have the choice to specialize in one country or region of Asia to demonstrate their learning. Assessment of student learning will include group work, individual projects and presentations. This course can be taken in either grade 11 or 12.

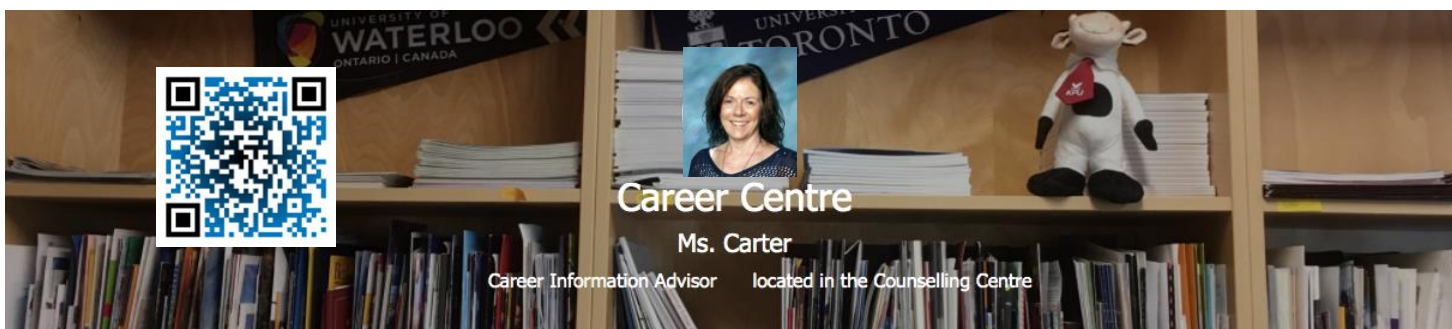

The Lionel Chemistry Scholarship has been established to assist high-achieving high school students who shows an interest in chemistry, biochemistry or chemical engineering at a post-secondary institution but who would not otherwise be able to attend without significant financial assistance.

Selection is based on achievement in school, interest in chemical related studies, as well as financial need. The \$4000 scholarship is given for up to each of 4 years in the undergraduate program (student must maintain a B (75%) average minimum and provide acknowledgement annually that they are continuing in the program towards up to 4 years tuition in the program.

Eligibility: Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident.

Have shown an interest in chemistry related studies. Plan to enroll in a BSc program in chemistry, biochemistry or chemical engineering at a Canadian university.

Re: Traffic/Pick-up and Drop-Off at Burnett
