PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

We are incredibly thankful for the way in which students, staff, and our community responded to the challenges we faced together after the winter break. Students have done an excellent job following all the enhanced safety measures at the school. Thank you for your support in helping our students keep Burnett a safe place to work, learn, and lead. The latest guidance from the BCCDC and VCH is available on our <u>website</u>. We will work to help our students remain vigilant in maintaining health and safety protocols as we wait for an easing of Public Health Order restrictions. As a staff, we are optimistic that there are brighter days ahead for our learning community.

Despite the challenges, we have had an excellent month of learning at Burnett. Staff have adapted their curriculum and instruction helping our students finish the first semester strong. Staff agreed to cancel their professional collaboration time during BLT this month to allow more time for students to complete learning activities, go deeper in their understanding, and get extra help. I had the opportunity to visit many classrooms over the past several weeks and was impressed by the way in which students were demonstrating their learning in a variety of ways. Staff continue to design lessons and learning opportunities based on British Columbia's <u>redesigned curriculum</u>. Students shared with me many summative learning opportunities at the end of semester that reflected their understanding of Big Ideas, Curricular and Core Competencies. We are proud of the learning and engagement that happens every day. Please enjoy a small sample in our *Learning in Focus* section in every newsletter.

In January, our *Use Your Voice* club led our school in learning about *Black Excellence Day* placing posters of significant societal contributions made by Black people. Many students wore black in support of the day and staff were provided resources to lead discussions in their classrooms. The month of February is *Black History Month*. Our Library Learning Commons has many excellent resources available for staff and students. January 28th was *International Holocaust Remembrance Day*. Many of our social studies classrooms took time to deepen their understanding and review the importance of remembering the Holocaust. Along with the Richmond School District, Burnett is committed to becoming a more inclusive and equitable school each day. On January 31st, our staff participated in an informative professional development day on how we can be more active in being an anti-racist community.

February is a very busy month at Burnett. Please take the time to review the events calendar and read the <u>Week at a Glance</u> each week. In a few days we will begin semester two. Semester change always provides an opportunity for students to make a fresh start and set meaningful educational and personal goals for the remainder of the year. This includes taking time for personal wellness, paying attention to mental health, sleeping well and regular exercise. The pandemic has been challenging for both students, staff, and families. Students are encouraged to reach out for help at any time.

PIVOTING IN THE PANDEMIC
