We continue to work towards our goal of an inclusive, healthy, and engaged learning community for everyone in alignment with the Richmond School District's <u>Strategic Plan</u>. Summary:

The Provincial Student/Parent/Staff Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

In March 2022, the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 8,9, 10, and 12. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local issues may be included.


The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link with or without an anonymous logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section.

To complete the survey:

- 1. Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access at home, work, or school.
- 2. Go to https://www.awinfosys.com/SurveyFull1/central/main/access.asp
- 3. Under the section Direct Access no logon number required select:
 - District: the name of your child's district
 - School: the name of your child's school
 - Language: the language of your choice
- 4. Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on the right arrow in the bottom right corner of the screen. Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.
- 5. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".
- 6. Once complete, your school will have the results immediately.

The e-survey site will be open until April 29th, 2022.


