October was a busy month at J.N. Burnett. We introduced our Collaboration time/ Burnett Learning Time schedule on October 5th and 6th. These are two of twelve planned collaboration days for staff this school year. On these days students attend BLT starting at 9:25 am. All families have been sent our collaboration day schedules recently. Please mark these days on your calendars. Our staff engaged in rich discussions about BC's redesigned curriculum and the new draft K-12 reporting year for the 2022-2023 school year. The focus is on improving student learning in all our work together. The Ministry of Education is seeking parent feedback until November 5th at K-12 Draft Reporting Order Feedback and Consultation. Your input is important.






