Dear Parent/Guardian,

Although the days continue to get shorter and the outside temperatures continue to drop, the positive energy and spirit inside the walls of Burnett keep this community strong. October is here, and Burnett Breaker Robotics is going strong. Last month, the team worked on recruitment and organizing members into work units. This month, the team has registered for the 2023 FIRST Robotics Competition at the Canadian Pacific Regional in Victoria, March 1-3.

KPU Wilson School of Design Mentors, Drs. Victor Martinez, and Flavio Ruiz Oliveras visited Burnett last week and issued a design challenge for the club to tackle. The design challenge is intended to help the club learn about simple robot movements and the design process, which will help greatly in the upcoming competition season.

Due to the rising costs of materials to build the robot, and travel and registration fees for competitions, our budget for this year is approximately \$25,000. If you require a reference letter or help with a post-secondary application, you are asked to give staff a minimum of two weeks' notice. The earlier you contact us, the more effective the outcome will be.

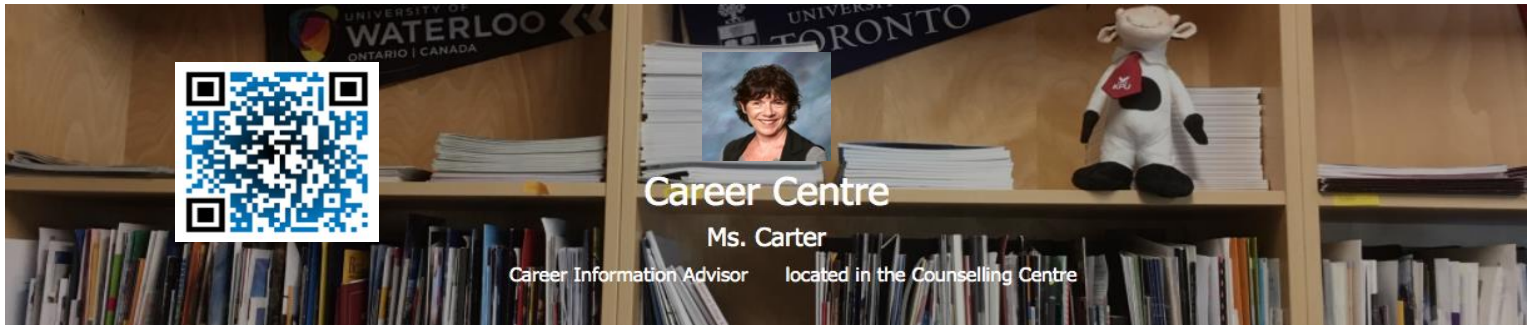

 Description: In this new SD38 post-secondary program students will earn an Early Childhood Educator (ECE) Assistant Certificate. The ECE program is designed to develop and enhance theoretical and practical skills, including a work experience component. 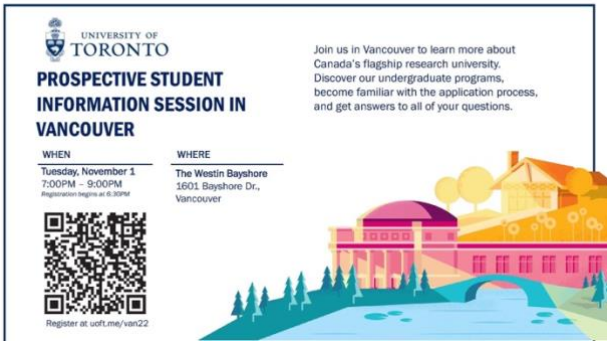

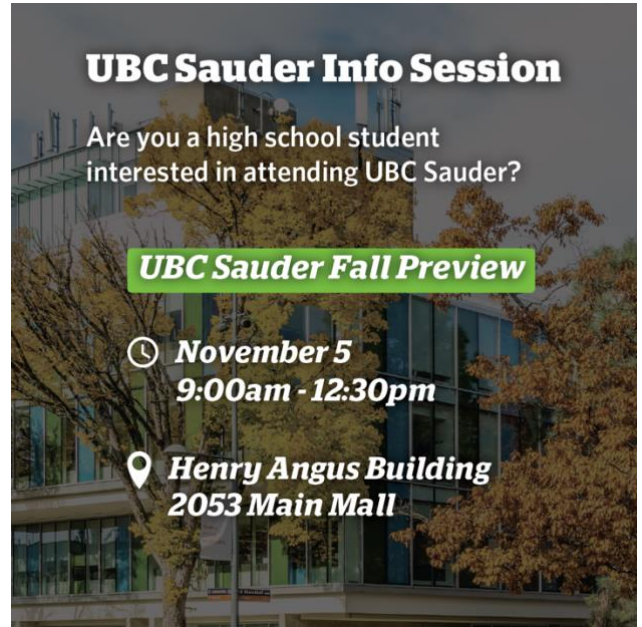

NOV 15/22 - In-school nomination deadline for the Lester B Pearson U of T International Scholarship

There are 37 scholarships awarded to outstanding International students who have demonstrated exceptional academics, leadership, creativity and are leaders in their school. A special emphasis is placed on the impact the student has had on the life of their school and community, and their future potential to contribute positively to the global community. Awarded annually, these most prestigious and competitive scholarships will cover tuition, books, incidental fees, and full residence support for four years. The scholarship is tenable only at the University of Toronto for first-entry, undergraduate programs.

To apply, Students must first follow the steps required to be nominated by your school. (Contact your school scholarship representative for details) fill in a nomination form and submit it by Nov. 15. Students should have applied to their U of T Program by Nov, 7 via OUAC. Once the application for nomination has been approved, that student then completes the Lester B Pearson application and submits it to U of T by January 17/22.

Recent Rescues



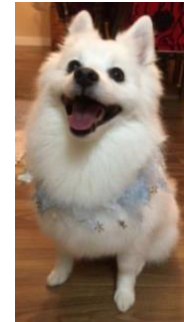

We offer flexible safe zones rather than kenneling for reactive dogs, and focus on integration over isolation.
