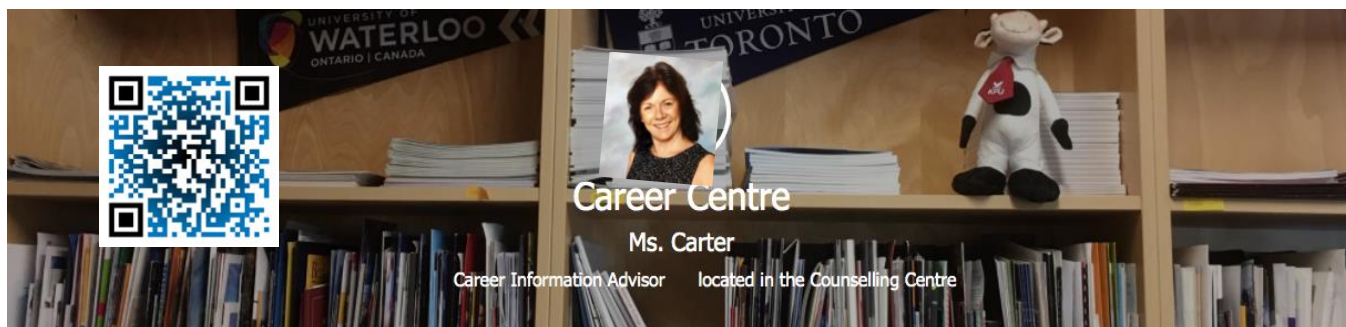

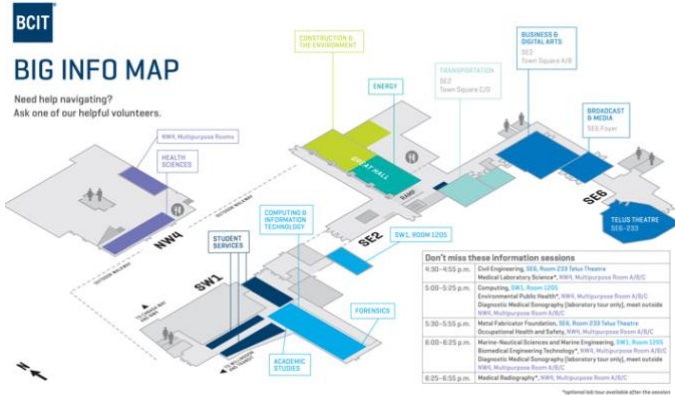

The National Scholarship rewards original, creative and committed Canadian secondary school students. These are students who demonstrate superior academic performance, original and creative thought, and exceptional achievement in a broad context. They excel in academic pursuits, demonstrate enthusiasm for intellectual exploration and have a strong involvement in the lives of their schools and communities.

Criteria: original & creative thinker, committed to school & community, a high achiever in academic & creative pursuits, enthusiastic about learning & intellectual exploration, a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person, currently in your final year of Canadian secondary school, intending to begin university in fall of 2024, a National Book Award nominee or self-identify as meeting the criteria above.

The National Scholarship covers tuition, incidental and residence fees for up to four years of study. Finalists not designated as National Scholars receive Arbor Scholarships at a value of \$7,500 in the first year and \$1,500 per year for three additional years of undergraduate study. The Lester B. Pearson International Scholarship at the University of Toronto provides an unparalleled opportunity for outstanding international students to study at one of the worlds' top universities.

Awarded annually, these scholarships are given to international students studying at Canadian high schools. There are 37 scholarships to be awarded to outstanding international students who have demonstrated exceptional academics, leadership, creativity and are leaders in their school. This competitive scholarship will cover tuition, books, incidental fees, and full residence support for four years. The scholarship is tenable only at the University of Toronto for first-entry, undergraduate programs. To apply, students must first contact their Counselling Department for more information before November 1/23.

Students should have applied to their U of T program by November 7th via OUAC. Once the application for nomination has been approved by the school, that student then completes the Lester B.
