PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Although the days continue to get shorter and the outside temperatures continue to drop, the positive energy and spirit inside the walls of Burnett keep this community strong. Our school clubs and athletic teams are back in full force, thanks to the active involvement of a high percentage of our students and staff.

When speaking with students, we challenge them to be active in their learning. Learning is an active process. It is not enough for students to merely show up at school, attend class, and hope that information will be passively transferred to them. The best learning happens when students take responsibility and participate with energy, interest, and enthusiasm.

Now that Semester 1 Interim Reports have been sent home, parents should have some more detailed information on how their child is progressing so far this school year. Now is a great time for parents to become more involved in their child's learning. Our students have had two months to settle into classes and to create effective routines. If these routines are going well and producing the desired results, then this is a great time for parents to celebrate this success and to continue to encourage their child.

However, this may also be a time that parents need to work with their child to adjust or improve some routines to help strengthen their child's progress. We encourage parents to ask their child questions about their learning, sit with them while they work on homework, and/or ask your child to teach you some of the concepts they are learning in school. As we approach colder, wet weather, it is also important that students maintain a balance of exercise, good nutrition, and adequate sleep to maintain a healthy and strong immune system.

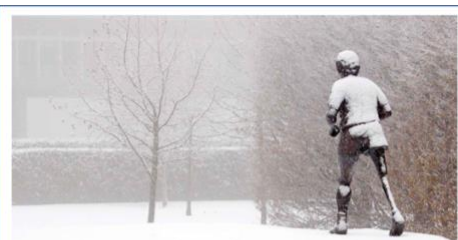

After snowfall events, Snow Angels help with removing snow from pathway leading to front door and side walk surrounding the residence. The Snow Angel program is a volunteer program and is dependent on resources, severity of the storm, number of volunteers available and the priority needs of other callers. Snow Angels activate when there is an accumulation of snow over 3 cm which stays for an extended period of time.

Snow Angels will be provided with a shovel, toque, and container of ice melt. Snow Angels will be responsible for providing their own protective gear (proper footwear, warm jacket, gloves, etc.).

Message from Burnett PAC

Re: Traffic/Pick-up and Drop-Off at Burnett

Please consider the following guidelines to improve safety and decrease congestion during heavy traffic times.

- Please Turn Right only during busy times at both the south and west exits onto Granville
- Avoid dropping children off at the side of the road or on the median on Granville and McCallan.
- Encourage students to walk or bike to school
- Drop your children several blocks away instead of coming into the parking lot
- Leave a few minutes earlier to avoid the rush
- Please pick up your children in the parking lot and not in the drop-off lane
- Don't double park
