

Dear Parents and Guardians,

WELCOME TO DECEMBER 🏂

We have allocated \$54,335.80 to student clubs, Dry Grad, our PAC Legacy Scholarships, PE equipment, the musical class, and 11 additional laptop requests from Burnett's library this year. PAC receives government funding at \$20 per student every year, and this year we received \$18,000. Including the funds raised by the Gala last year, plus government funding, we can only afford \$28,824.80 of expenses, leaving \$24,011.00 unaccounted for.
