
PE 10 Incentive

Europe Trip 2024

We are thrilled to report that our journey to Italy, Austria and Germany was a fantastic success.

Students and staff arrived in Rome on March 15th and explored the Spanish Steps, Trevi Fountain, the Vatican, Colosseum and Forum over 2 days. There were many opportunities to appreciate the vast history and culture of the Roman Empire while taking time to stop for a gelato, cappuccino, or pastry.

On our third day, we headed to Tuscany and the town of Florence, where students saw first-hand the people and places that sparked and developed the European Renaissance, such as Dante, Michelangelo, and Il Duomo. While some in our group took an excursion to Pisa to see the famous leaning tower, others stayed behind to wander the streets of Florence, tasting the various foods at the markets and finding treasures in shops.



Once again on the move, we visited Juliet's balcony in Verona before arriving at a resort town on the Adriatic Sea. Our next day involved water taxi rides to see a glass blowing demonstration on the isle of Murano and a full day exploring the streets and canals of Venice, including a tour of the Doge's Palace and St Mark's Square.

Following this day, we took our final drive through the northern mountains of Italy, with a short stopover and lunch in Innsbruck, Austria, before reaching our final destination, Munich, Germany. In Munich, we enjoyed the bratwurst and schnitzel, visited the BMW plant, saw the 1972 Olympic site, the Nymphenburg Palace, and visited the Dachau Memorial.

In the busy Technology Education classroom, a group of ambitious students comes together with a shared vision: to build an electric go-kart and compete in the national racing competition started by Edison Motors, named the EV Rodeo 2024. The Manufacturing and Engineering Coop program, known as MEC, comprises a team of engineering enthusiasts fueled by a passion for innovation. Led by their teacher, Mr. Bevan, whose knack for tinkering and problem-solving propels the project forward, the team members each contribute unique skills, from CAD Design to Welding, transforming a collection of electric parts into a sleek, high-performance racing machine. Busy days in the workshop are filled with the hum of power tools and the buzz of excitement as the kart takes shape before their eyes. As the competition approaches, the team encounters challenges and setbacks, from technical glitches to budget constraints, but they refuse to be deterred. Soon they will be ready to race in Merit, BC at the end of May, competing against 25 other teams from all over B.C.
