- ❑ Tuition for the first level of these programs is paid by Richmond SD38. This is typically a savings of \$2500-\$5000!

Students can earn up to 16 high school credits (four courses) at the Grade 11/12 level

These courses are taken off-timetable and consist of 120 paid work hours and three short, online assignments per course

Student's job must be in a [SkilledTradesBC recognized trade](#) under a certified journey-person who is willing to sponsor the student as an apprentice

Students must be between the ages of 15-19

Hours worked count toward [apprenticeship with SkilledTradesBC](#)

During high school, students may concurrently apply to enroll in a District Youth TRAIN in Trades program or, upon graduation students have an opportunity to register in a college/university technical training program for their trade.

General admission requirements

- A holistic approach for admission: ie. Value **ALL** learning in High School, not just marks
- Relevancy, Breadth (Variety) and Rigour (Difficulty of course such as AP) of Coursework

UBC ADMISSIONS FOR 2025

- Overall Academic Assessment based on all academic Grade 11 and 12 marks.
- At least 6 academic/non-academic Grade 12 courses (academics are more desirable)
- Core Academic Assessment – Specific courses for each faculty/Program
- Personal Profile
- Check each faculty for specific course requirements

SFU ADMISSION FOR 2025

- ❑ A minimum of 5 approved Grade 12 courses (including English Studies/equivalent, min. 70%)
- ❑ Admission is based on an evaluation of all approved Grade 11 and 12 courses, with greater emphasis on List A courses over List B

FAILS AND INCOMPLETES (0 to 49%) (REQUIRED ACADEMIC COURSES)

- ❑ All compulsory courses must be repeated if failed (English Language Arts, Socials, Math, Science, PHED)
 - ❑ Example: If you failed English 11, take English 11 in first semester of grade 12 and then take English 12 in second semester
