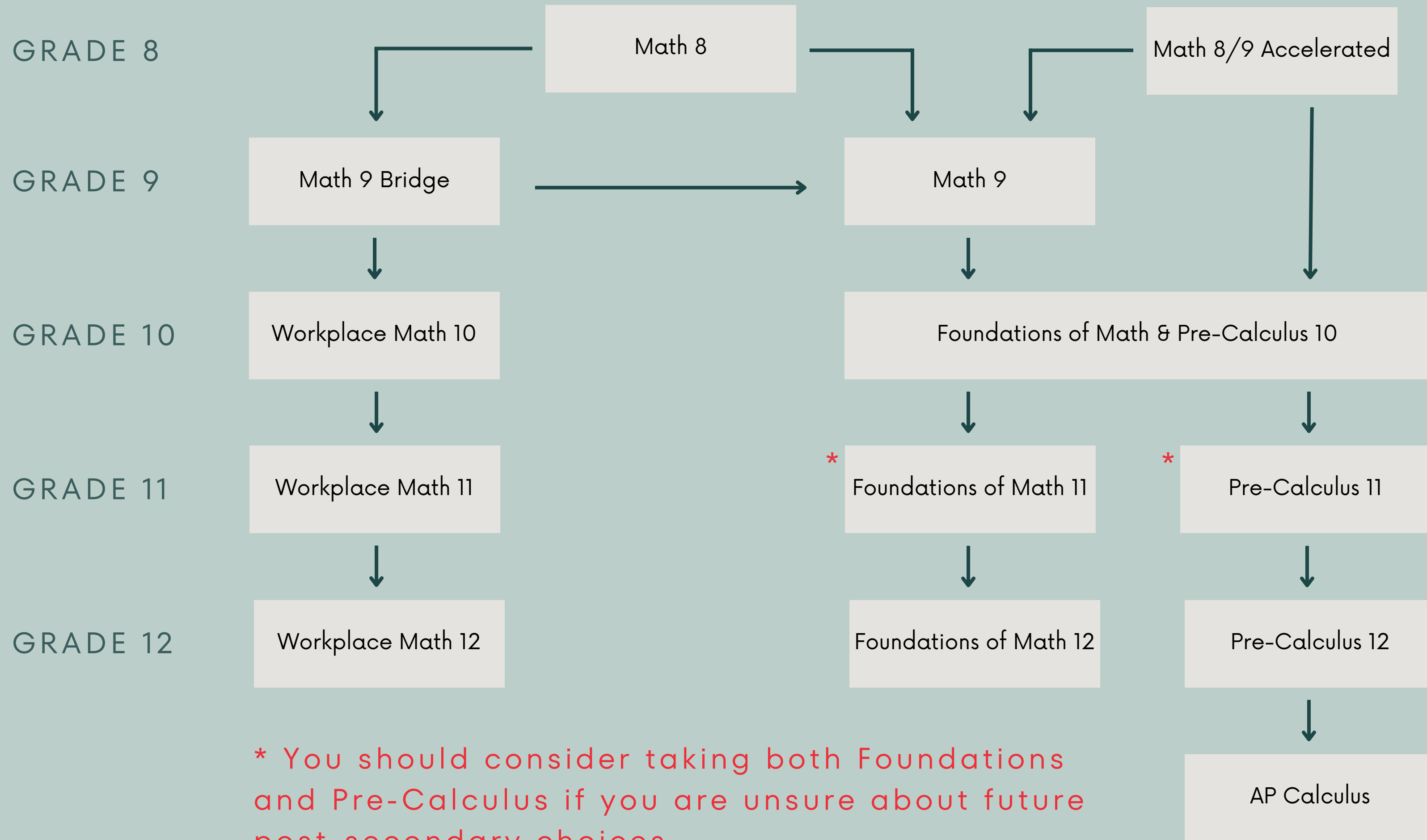

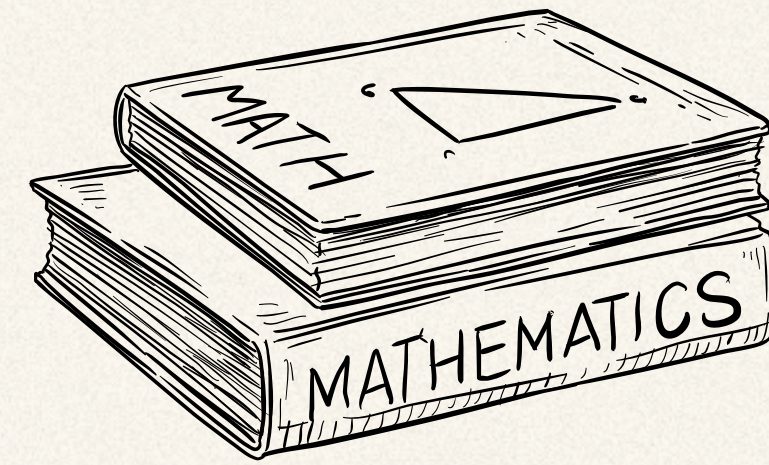
English 10 credits are split into two, so don't be alarmed if you only see 2 credits on your learning update instead of 4!

FOUNDATIONS & PRE-CALCULUS

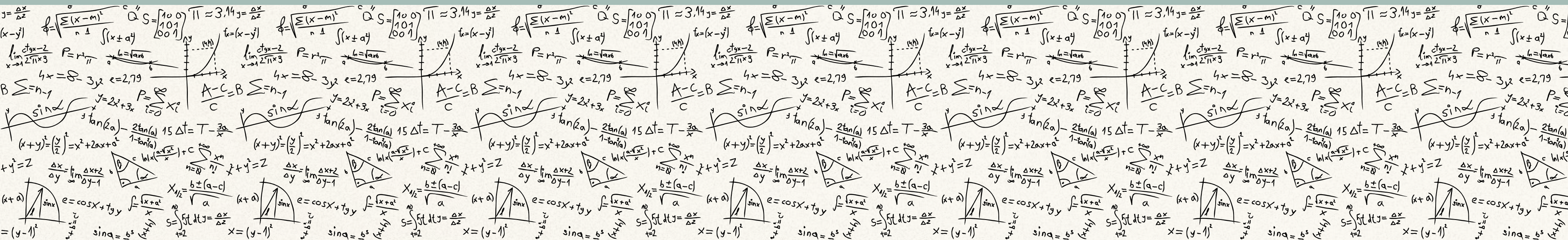
- Builds on grade 9 math

PHYSICAL & HEALTH EDUCATION INCENTIVE

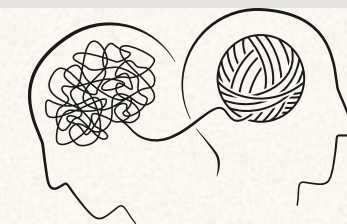
- Leadership based and emphasis on sports, outdoor activities, and recreation

POWERFIT (FITNESS & CONDITIONING)

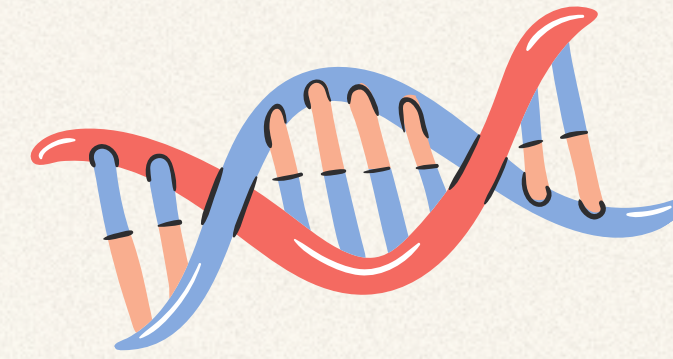
- Fitness based course focused on achieving fitness goals

- Field trips cost around \$50 for the term

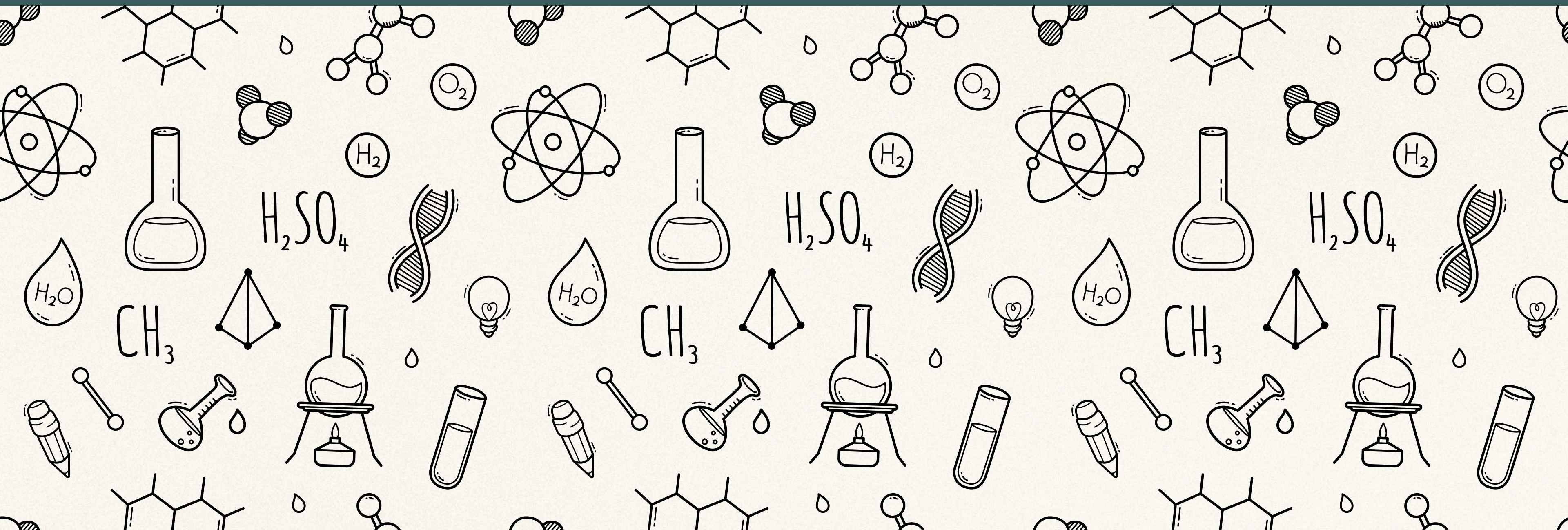
