
### Social Studies 12



Number of blocks are calculated using class size limits and crossreferenced with available staffing

Number of blocks for courses is finalized to meet the total blocks a school receives and available staffing



Students can request changes, but only with what is available

No new blocks are added at this time

## What Does This Mean?

The timetable is built based on what students request <u>NOW</u>. Requests after the due date may not be possible as the timetable is already built.

Take the time <u>NOW</u> to have your child research courses, talk to teachers, talk to their counsellor, talk to the career advisor, and look at prospective post-secondary options and requirements.

> Include alternative courses! We cannot guarantee students will get their first choice. A well-built timetable can only satisfy approximately 80% of all student requests.


