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## Introduction

The Province of British Columbia has declared its commitment to access to education for all students with accessibility challenges. Through the development of policy, procedures and the implementation of programs, the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills (PSFS) supports student needs at post-secondary education institutions through the development and delivery of programs and services of the Accessibility Supports Framework (ASF).

Programs and services for students with disabilities have grown and improved over the past decades. The objective of the PSFS ASF is to ensure that students with accessibility challenges are appropriately represented in the post-secondary population, receive barrier free access to education and acquire the skills and training necessary to transition to the labour market.

Eligibility for programs under the ASF will include students with a verified Permanent Disability (PD) and students with a verified Persistent or Prolonged Disability (PPD).

PD is defined as:

*“any impairment, including a physical, mental, intellectual, cognitive, learning, communication or sensory impairment - or a functional limitation - that restricts the ability of a person to perform the daily activities necessary to pursue studies at a post-secondary school level or to participate in the labour force and that is expected to remain with the person for the person’s expected life.”*

PPD is defined as:

*“any impairment, including a physical, mental, intellectual, cognitive, learning, communication or sensory impairment - or a functional limitation - that restricts the ability of a person to perform the daily activities necessary to pursue studies at a post-secondary school level or to participate in the labour force and has lasted, or is expected to last, for a period of at least 12 months but is not expected to remain with the person for the person’s expected life.”*

The Accessibility Programs and Services Resource Directory has been developed in consultation with the Accessibility Services Articulation Committee and is updated on an annual basis. The document is intended to provide information on programs available through the ASF and Accessibility Support Service contacts for potential students, their counselors, families, and referral agencies.

The Directory is organized alphabetically by institution, with separate listings of services and programs. The Accessibility Services or Resource Centre is the contact area at post-secondary institutions for students identifying as having a disability and seeking Accessibility Support Services. The Accessibility office provides accessible learning, environmental services and supports to students with disabilities through liaison with faculty and other campus offices in a manner that is supportive of the students' educational needs.

The office also collaborates with PSFS and external service providers as needed to support students with disabilities. All services and accommodations are assigned based on assessment information provided by medical assessors and the student outlining the nature and extent of their disability and the functional impact(s) they may experience in an educational environment. Students are advised to access Accessibility Support Services at their respective institution Accessibility Centre two to four months before starting classes to allow for accommodation planning and preparation.

### Public Post-Secondary Accessibility Supports Services

The following is a general process for the provision of services and supports. More detailed information can be obtained by contacting the Accessibility Office at each institution.

#### Introductory Meeting

- To acquire information relevant to assessing educational access needs
- Opportunity for the student and accessibility services staff to build a relationship
- Accessibility Services staff can discuss procedures with students
- Opportunity for the student to articulate their needs
- Discuss accessibility as it relates to educational and physical access
- Discuss and acquire documentation (Colleges and Universities have documentation requirement guidelines)
- Review historical information
- Begin problem solving and planning for supports and services
- Make referrals as needed
- Assistance in the acquisition of financial assistance
- Acquire written consents as needed

- Determine appropriate accommodations: decisions are based on documentation, student reported need, historical information, essential requirements of the course or program, and Institutional Accommodation Policy
- The appropriate level of accommodation is provided to ensure any barriers to education are reduced as much as possible.

### Accessibility Support Programs

Financial assistance and assistive equipment/services programs have been established to support students requiring accessibility-related accommodations. This section summarizes these programs. These programs are available to students who have verified their disability as either a PD or PPD with StudentAid BC (SABC). #### Assistance Program for Student with Disabilities (APSD)

**Amount:** Up to \$10,000 per annum (\$12,000 if attendant care services required)

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need

**Application:** Appendix 8 (Full Time or Part Time) (Disability Programs Application Form) for post-secondary programs and the APSD Application Form for non post-secondary programs.

**Special Documentation Requirements:** Medical Documentation (if non post-secondary)

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Screening of applicants and administration of program

#### [BC Access Grant for Students with a Disability \(BCAG-D\)](#)

**Amount:** Will replace up to \$1,560 per annum of BC Student Loan funding with this non-repayable grant.

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan.

**Application:** Appendix 8 (Full Time or Part Time) Form (one time)

#### [BC Access Grant for Deaf Students \(BCAG-DS\)](#)

**Amount:** Up to \$30,000 per annum

**Eligibility:** Verified hearing disability, student loan eligible and attending Gallaudet University or Rochester Technical Institute.

**Application:** Appendix 8 (Full Time or Part Time) Form (one time)

#### [BC Supplementary Bursary for Students with Disabilities \(SBSD\)](#)

**Amount:** Up to \$800 per annum for Full-Time Students and up to \$400 per annum for Part-Time Students

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan

#### [Canada Student Grant for Persons with Disabilities \(CSG-PD\)](#)

**Amount:** \$2,800 per annum

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan.

### Canada Student Grant for Services and Equipment for Persons with Disabilities (CSG-DSE)

**Amount:** Up to \$20,000 per annum

**Eligibility:** Verified disability and demonstrated financial need through application for a student loan.

**Application:** Appendix 8 (Full Time or Part Time) Form

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Requires signature and completion of applicable section of Appendix 8 (Full Time or Part Time). Accessibility Coordinators encouraged to be involved in the Technology Assessment Plan process with Assistive Technology British Columbia (ATBC)

### Disability Assessment Reimbursement (part of CSG-DSE)

**Amount:** Maximum of 100% of the cost of a medical assessment up to \$3,500

**Eligibility:** Verified disability

**Application:** Appendix 8 (Full Time or Part Time) Form

**Special Documentation Requirements:** Attachment of medical assessment and paid receipt.

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Assisting student with application for reimbursement

### Learning Disability Assessment Bursary (LDAB)

**Amount:** Up to \$3,500 towards purchase of a psycho-educational assessment

**Eligibility:** Student Loan eligible, in post-secondary program and recommended by Accessibility Coordinator

**Application:** Learning Disability Assessment Bursary Application Form

**Accessibility Coordinator Involvement:** Screening of applicants and administration of program

Academic Communication Equity (ACE) is funded by PSFS and housed at the British Columbia Institute of Technology. The program's mandate is to promote public post-secondary education that is accessible for students who experience communication challenges (ex: Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Deaf-Blind etc.) attending or planning to attend post-secondary in British Columbia. Supports are provided to accessibility support staff, administrators, staff, and service providers working in post-secondary institutions across BC. The program also offers resources for students who want to explore service options in post-secondary. ACE offers:

- Consultation related to accommodation planning
- Resources on hearing loss and communication access
- Provincial Guidelines and Pay Scales for interpreting and transcribing
- Job descriptions for service providers
- Services such as the Post-Secondary Interpreting Screen and Employment Registry
- Workshops on legal access, accommodation planning, managing human resource issues, skill building for interpreters and transcribers, and strategies that promote classroom access.

ATBC recognizes that disability reflects diverse characteristics and experiences integral to society. To that end, ATBC collaborates with persons with disabilities and members of the learning and working environments in which they interact, to create usable, equitable, inclusive and sustainable environments through the use of assistive technology.

### **CSG-DSE**

### **Program for Institutional Loans of Adaptive Technology (PILAT)**

The PILAT program is designed to support public post-secondary institutions in meeting their duty to accommodate students with disabilities through the provision of supplementary assistive technology resources. The program supplements existing institutional resources as extraordinary

issues arise through the provision of assistive technology support, training on the use of assistive technology to institutional staff, and bulk pricing for institutional purchases.

### **Public Post-Secondary Loan Service (PPL)**

The PPL program is designed to provide for the loan of assistive technology to students with disabilities in post-secondary who are not able to access other existing support programs (CSG-DSE or APSD).

- Processing requests for alternate formats;
- Loaning alternate formats from CAPER and partner collections through resource acquisition and sharing;
- Researching and coordinating new technology and product evaluations and implementing efficiency tools,
- Providing information and advisory services for student assignments, research, teaching and learning through the use of alternate formats and assistive technology;
- Training students and staff in the use of alternate formats; and
- Producing accessible formats.

- The most common request is for course text material to be converted into a different format for access purposes.
